My name is Ross Schwyhart and as the head judge I wish to welcome you to the 22nd annual Rocky Mountain Mustang Roundup!

It is hard to realize that 23 years ago the 7 founding Front Range Mustang clubs came with the idea of getting their clubs together for an opportunity to see each other's Mustangs, do some bench racing, and have fun together. From these humble beginnings came the event you are attending this year.

From its start the Roundup has been about having fun and Mustangs! The first few shows were low-key events. Heck, they were so low key that the hot dogs and hamburgers for the hospitality cookout were kept on ice in the bath tub of one of the committee member's hotel room! Each year the Roundup has gotten bigger and better, until it is what it is today.

This year we are expecting up to 600 entries divided into 42 classes! As you can imagine the task of judging that many Mustangs is daunting. The Roundup is fortunate to have the help of the city of Steamboat Springs in providing volunteers to judge Saturday's Show n' Shine. They have been provided with guidelines for judging your Mustang. Please remember this is not a Mustang Club of America show!

All Mustangs will be judged for overall appearance, cleanliness of the exterior, interior, engine compartment, and at the entrant's option, trunk. In the event of 2 Mustangs being tied extra consideration will be given to those Mustangs, which participated in Thursday's cruise and/or Friday's autocross.

We ask that no For Sale signs be displayed on cars entered in the Show n' Shine. Judges have been instructed to deduct points on cars with such signs. Class QQ is for Mustangs that are For Sale.

The judge's decisions are final and their results will not be made public. I will be at the judges' tent should you have any questions or comments about judging. The goal of the Roundup committee is for everyone to have fun and to make this a memorable experience.
